**Two Defendants Sentenced to 20 Years for Armed Robbery at Canton Apartment Complex**  
**State vs. Nasheem Daquan Davis and Kai Marley Greenwood**

**November 26, 2025** – Cherokee County District Attorney Susan K. Treadaway announces that Nasheem Daquan Davis, 22, of Canton, and Kai Marley Greenwood, 19, of Woodstock, pled guilty to charges stemming from an armed robbery that took place in Canton in 2022. Both defendants were sentenced to 20 years, with the first 10 years to be served in confinement.

In separate plea hearings, the co-defendants admitted to five charges: two counts of armed robbery, two counts of aggravated assault, and one count of possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony. Davis was sentenced on November 17 and Greenwood on November 19.

The Canton Police Department began investigating after a 911 caller reported an armed robbery at the Walden Crossing Apartments around 5 p.m. on September 17, 2022. The victims told police that after stopping their car at the gate to enter the complex, two armed men approached and demanded the cash they had just withdrawn from an ATM at a Woodstock QuikTrip. The driver and passenger handed over approximately \$120. Witnesses provided descriptions of the suspects and the car they were driving.

Investigators used surveillance video, Flock camera data, cell phone call detail records (CDR), and GPS information to develop the case. Footage from the surveillance and Flock cameras confirmed the suspects' identities and showed them at the QuikTrip watching the victims withdraw money from the ATM. CDR data traced the defendants' movements from the QuikTrip to the apartment complex entrance and then to Shipp Street, where the vehicle was abandoned. A forensic analysis of Davis' cell phone revealed communications and Google searches further tying him to the armed robbery.

In addition, while executing a search warrant at Davis' residence, law enforcement recovered one of the firearms used in the armed robbery, as well as a BB gun. Greenwood stated at his plea hearing that he used a BB gun. At the time of the incident, Greenwood was 16 years old. Due to the violent nature of the offense, the District Attorney's Office prosecuted him as an adult in Superior Court.

"The victims in this case should have been able to safely go to a gas station and withdraw money from an ATM," said Assistant District Attorney Megan S. Hertel, who prosecuted this case on behalf of the State. "This was an impulsive and dangerous crime. Their actions that day caused significant trauma for a small amount of cash."

During the sentencing hearings this week, Superior Court Judge Jennifer L. Davis followed the negotiated sentences and ordered that both Davis and Greenwood serve 20 years, with the first 10 years to be served in

confinement. They were also ordered to pay restitution, have no contact with the victims or each other, complete 250 hours of community service, and fulfill other special conditions of probation.

“We are grateful for the diligent efforts of the Canton Police Department in identifying and apprehending these violent offenders,” said District Attorney Susan K. Treadaway. “This sentence reflects our commitment to public safety and ensures that those who choose to prey on members of our community will face serious consequences.”

The case was investigated by the Canton Police Department, with assistance from the Cherokee Sheriff’s Office. Prosecution was handled by Assistant District Attorney Megan S. Hertel, of the Gang/Organized Crime Unit, Office of the District Attorney, Blue Ridge Judicial Circuit.
